



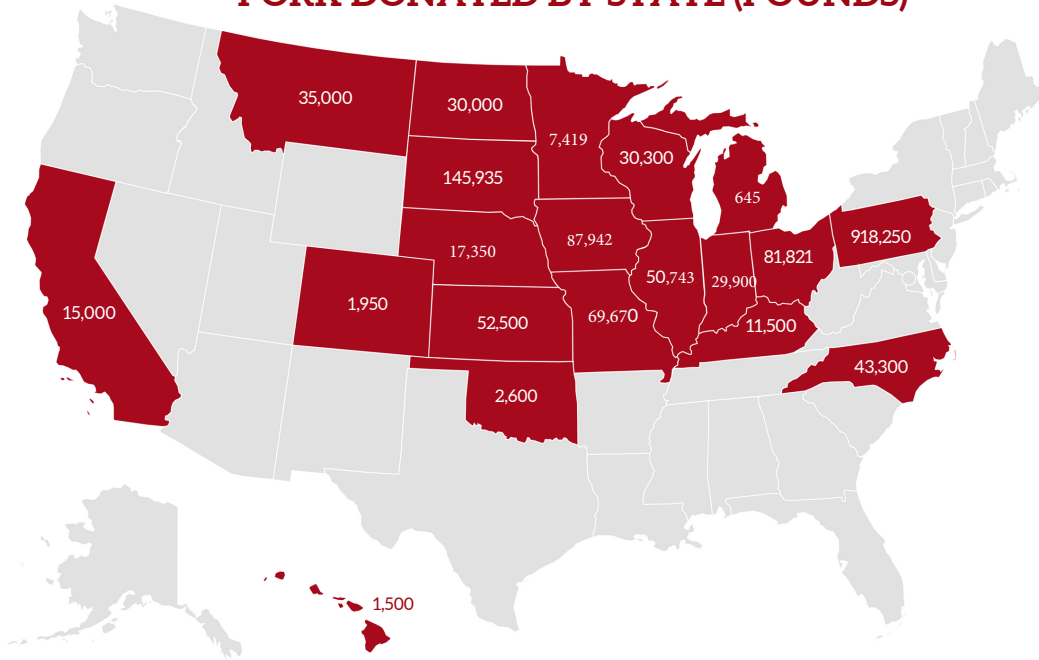

PORK DONATED BY STATE (POUNDS)

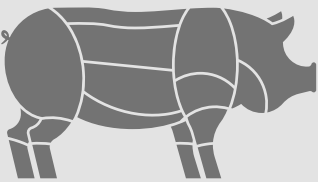
